What is the Day Camp at Plum Creek?

- Christian-based adventure camp, a federally recognized 501 (c)(3) non-profit organization

How is the camp staff certified?

- 2-week training sessions, taught by Day Camp Director, Board President, EMS, nurses, and additional community professionals
- Association for Challenge Course Technology (ACCT) instruction, taught by ACCT-certified instructor



What does the ACCT certification mean?

- Association for Challenge Course Technology certification requires that "quality and safety [standards] are met for installation, inspection, operation, and ethical practices as delivered by vendors, institutional and individual member program providers"

Who can participate in the camp?

- Elementary-aged children who have completed grades 1 through 6

When can elementary children attend camp?

- Session 1 ~ June 28 — July 2
- Session 2 ~ July 5 — July 9
- Session 3 ~ July 12 — July 16
- Session 4 ~ July 19 — July 23



What activities will occur at the camp?

- Morning & afternoon worship rallies
- Bible studies
- Climbing tower
- Zip line
- Low ropes course
- Mountain boarding
- Water games
- Team sports
- Arts & crafts
- Mobile team-building initiatives
- Additional electives
- Rainy day activities
- Snacks (*provided for campers*)
- Lunch



What other information do I need to know?

- *Lunch*— bring bag lunch from home daily
- *Staff shirt*—one is provided by Day Camp Board of Directors, and additional shirts can be purchased by staff
- *Camp photo*—one all-camp and staff photo will be taken on a weekly basis



I have a child who is too old to attend as a camper. What else can he/she do at camp?

- **Support Staff**—middle school-aged individuals who volunteer during one Training Week and a second week-long session. These jobs, although unpaid, provide much-needed assistance to all staff members, wherever and whenever needed throughout each day.
- **Counselor-in-Training**— high school-aged individuals who work during Training Weeks and Sessions 1-4. These jobs involve co-teaching Bible studies with counselors, participating in daily scheduled activities, and other supportive activities as needed.
- **Counselor**— college-aged students (18+ years old) who work during Training Weeks and Sessions 1-4. These jobs involve leading Bible studies, rallies, team sports, and electives, as well as participating in daily scheduled activities, and other supportive needs.
- **Adventure Staff**— college-aged students (19+ years old) who work during Training Weeks and Sessions 1-4. These jobs involve leading mountain boarding, the low ropes course, the climbing tower, and the zip line, as well as assisting in daily scheduled activities, and other supportive needs.
