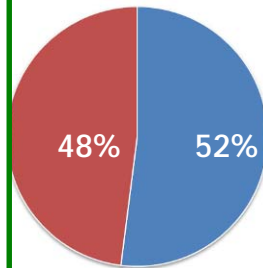

What is the Day Camp at Plum Creek?

- A Christian-based adventure camp for elementary aged children. The camp is located in Plum Borough and features challenge elements such as a low-ropes course, climbing tower, zip line, mountain boarding, as well as arts and crafts, team sports, Bible study, drama, praise and worship, faith stories, nature education, and much more



How is the Camp staff trained?

- ACCT Certified Instructors annually inspect the Challenge Course equipment for structural strength and safety and to train, test, and certify our Counselors and Adventure Staff to daily inspect the course and lead fun, safe, and challenging adventure activities
- CPR certification and first aid training by EMS
- Additional training in instructional strategies for Bible studies and testimonies, legal and behavioral issues, and more by Day Camp Director, DC@PC Board President, nurses, and additional community resources

What does the ACCT certification mean?

- The Association for Challenge Course Technology (ACCT) is accredited by the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) to set Industry Standards for Equipment, Installation, Inspection, and Operation of Challenge Courses, and the Qualifications and Certification of Challenge Course Professionals. ACCT Certification acknowledges compliance with these standards.
